## Killer drivi suspect caught

Just mere footsteps from boarding a plane that would take him overseas, a Calgary suspect was nabbed for the hit-and-run death of a young

woman. Sgt. Russ Van Aalst said the 48-year-old suspect was checking in at Toronto's Pearson International Air-

port when cops swooped in.
"Members of Peel Regional Police Service took him into custody just

before midnight Monday," he said.

today. The U of C student was walking in a crosswalk on Bonaventure Dr., near Fairmount Dr. S.E., after 8 p.m. She was on her way to a nearby

strip mall to meet her boyfriend when

he got off work, her parents said.

Lindsay, a talented dancer with dreams of working for the Disney corporation, was struck by an SUV that left her unconscious on the side of the road with critical head injuries.

The driver fled and Lindsay later died in Foothills hospital.

While the young woman's devas-tated family was left to plan her funeral, the hit-and-run unit worked tire-lessly to find the person responsible. Using paint chips at the scene and

witness accounts, police narrowed the search until they found the suspect SUV — a red, late-model Dodge Durango — in Cochrane. When they tried to locate the reg-

istered owner of the vehicle, cops telling learned he had left Alberta, friends he was taking a vacation.
